To celebrate this exciting news, you are all invited to our Open House on December 9, so you can see how we have been able to upgrade and modernize our century old home to allow us to sustain the building for many years to come.

Park House is many things to many people, including a community center and an historical landmark, but above all it is home to up to 16 residents seeking out companionship, assistance, and community. Residents of Park House are as diverse as all of our community's citizens. Some live on fixed incomes while others are more financially comfortable; some are healthy and vibrant while others are more physically limited.

Park House has maintained its commitment to provide affordable housing to seniors in our community for the past 26 years. Construction, Construction and More Construction

We first mentioned our intention to renovate Park House in our 2014 newsletter. At that time, we were looking into securing planning funds to help with developing a plan to modernize our facility by increasing energy efficiency and assessing long term needs of the building. In 2015 we were one step closer. Having been awarded a feasibility grant from Vermont Housing and Conservation Board and a planning grant from Vermont Community Development Fund sponsored by the Town of Rochester, we were underway with an architect and consultant hired to help prepare a scope of work, identify funding sources, and prepare applications.



Last year, we reported on the success of our grant and fundraising efforts and unveiled our finalized renovation plans that included improving energy efficiency, adding a sprinkler system, making building code improvements, and updating the elevator and alarm system. In addition to these "mechanical" improvements, we included plans to add private bathrooms to most of our rooms, replace windows, add heat pumps to residents' rooms, and to upgrade the kitchen. We were so pleased that our successful funding partnerships allowed us to

make vital improvements in our century old home as well as make upgrades to improve the level of comfort, privacy, and enjoyment of our residents.

As we report on the achievements of the past year, we are now thrilled to say that construction is nearing completion! Safety standards have been raised with a new fire alarm system and sprinklers throughout the facility, and energy efficiency has been improved as planned with new insulation, windows and heating systems. This will sustain the building for many years to come.

Residents that have moved around the building to accommodate construction schedules are moved back into the their newly renovated rooms and are enjoying their new ADA accessible bathrooms, freshly painted walls, easily operated and insulated windows, and heat pumps that allow them to set the temperature in their rooms how they like. We've renovated laundry rooms and even added a laundry room on the third floor! We are putting the finishing touches on our new kitchen that has included new flooring, cabinetry, appliances and a commercial hood.



The remainder of the living areas have also really come together and will benefit along with the rest of the building with new insulation and windows, including a complete renovation of the second floor living room.

As one would expect when renovating a century old building, we have run into multiple hurdles along the way, from mildly inconvenient to threatening the entire project. Park House staff, contractors, volunteers and residents worked through issues patiently showing great understanding and flexibility in trying times. We would like to thank everyone that leant a helping hand through this process and look forward to celebrating the completion of this long endeavor with the community.



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
